 - High school equivalency diploma (formerly GED) test scores (if applicable). A high school transcript must still be submitted.
 - Colleges/universities attended other than BC3

Only complete application packets will be considered in the review process. It is the student's responsibility to submit all required documentation by the deadline of October 31, 2017. We are pleased that you are interested in the Butler County Community College (BC3) Nursing Program. Enclosed is the information you need to complete your application. Applications for the Fall 2018 class will be accepted from <u>July 1, 2017 to October 31, 2017</u>. Prospective students who meet the proposed criteria on Page 6 at the time of application may be considered for early acceptance.

Only complete application packets will be considered in the review process. We highly encourage you to make a copy of this information for your personal records prior to submission.

OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS/INSTRUCTIONS:

- Applicants must submit to the BC3 Admissions Office as part of their Nursing application packet, official transcripts from their high school, and from <u>EVERY</u> college/university attended at the time their application is submitted aside from BC3 transcripts. Official transcripts are to be in a sealed envelope from the institution or sent electronically on the student's behalf to <u>admissions@bc3.edu</u>. Students who completed the high school equivalency diploma (formerly GED) are required to submit a copy of their test scores as well as the high school transcript.
- Students enrolled in high school or another college/university during the Fall 2017 semester must submit official transcripts to reflect their courses in progress. Official college/university transcripts with final Fall 2017 grades must be received by the BC3 Admissions Office no later than January 8, 2018.
- It is the student's responsibility to request all official transcripts and to verify with the BC3
 Admissions Office they have been received on their behalf. Missing transcripts or official
 transcripts received after the above-stated deadlines will result in an incomplete application,
 and as such, applicants will not be considered for admission into the Fall 2018 Nursing Program.
- If you previously sent transcripts to BC3, it is still necessary for you to include an additional, official copy of all transcripts with your application for inclusion in your nursing folder.

PLACEMENT TESTS: IF REQUIRED CALL 724-287-8711 Ext. 8346 to schedule.

 An applicant who has not completed a college level English and/or math class with a "C" or better <u>must</u> complete placement exams in Sentence Skills, Reading Comprehension, and Arithmetic or submit SAT/ACT scores that are within the last 5 years and meet the following cut-offs to be exempt. If placement testing is required, it must be completed no later than December 15, 2017.

o **SAT Math:** 570 or better (*Old SAT prior to March 1, 2016*: 550 or better)

• SAT Evidence-Based Reading/Writing: 500 or better (*Old SAT Critical Reading prior to March 1, 2016:* 500 or better)

ACT Math: 23 or betterACT English: 21 or better

- An applicant who tests into a developmental or a preparatory class is permitted to re-test once in each subject area. All re-tests must also be completed by December 15, 2017.
- An applicant who tests into developmental or preparatory courses will not be considered for admission into the Fall 2018 Nursing Program <u>unless</u> those courses are completed with a "C" or better by the end of the Fall 2017 semester. Grades in developmental and preparatory coursework <u>are not</u> calculated when determining GPA.

LABORATORY SCIENCE REQUIREMENTS:

- It is required that applicants have a high school or college-level Biology with a laboratory component and Chemistry with a laboratory component within the past five years both passed with a "C" or better.
- <u>Biology and Chemistry courses completed prior to August 2012 will not be considered</u>. There will be no exceptions to this requirement.
- It is the student's responsibility to confirm that their high school Biology and Chemistry courses included the laboratory component.
- Nursing ABC Biology and Chemistry are **NOT** options for meeting these requirements.
- College-level Anatomy & Physiology 1 and 2 must be completed at the same institution.
- College-level Anatomy & Physiology 1, 2 and General Microbiology, completed at the college level, must have been taken within the past five years.

APPLICATION REVIEW PROCESS:

- Completed application packets will be reviewed by the Nursing Admissions Committee beginning in January 2018 (unless eligible for early acceptance; see Page 6 for more info).
- Grade point average (GPA) and additional academic criteria are considered in the review
 process. Successful completion of Pre-Nursing support courses are strongly considered for
 those with current or previous college/university experience. Seats available to high school
 seniors applying for both the Three Year Curriculum and Two Year Program are limited.

The GPA used will consist of the following:

- High school GPA will be used for applicants with less than 12 earned college-level credits.
- Applicants with 12+ BC3 credits (excluding any developmental or preparatory classes)
 will have their BC3 GPA used.
- Applicants with 12+ college level credits from the same institution (excluding any developmental or preparatory classes) will have that college's GPA used if that institution was most recently attended by the student.
- Applicants with combined college credits (12+ college credits completed, fewer than 12 at college of most recent attendance) will have their combined college GPA used.
- All applicants must have a 2.80 cumulative GPA minimum for Nursing Program consideration.
- All applicants will be notified by the Admissions Selection Committee in writing by February 16, 2018.

ADDITIONAL NOTES/REQUIREMENTS:

- Students must be at least 18 years of age by **September 1, 2018** to be eligible for admission to the Nursing Program.
- Applicants must have completed 4 units of English, 3 units of Social Studies, 2 units of Math (one must be Algebra) as part of their high school graduation requirements.
- A student with a high school equivalency diploma (formerly GED) must take 12+ college-level credits to establish a GPA.
- Individuals with less than a cumulative 2.80 GPA in high school or from previous college/ university experience may be considered for admission following completion of 12+ collegelevel credits to establish a new GPA. Nursing Program support courses are strongly encouraged.
- A grade of "C" or better is required in all Nursing Program support courses for acceptance and continuation in the program.
- Any student utilizing the Academic Forgiveness Policy at BC3 must complete the entire process through the Records and Registration Office prior to application review in January 2018.
- All college-level classes taken to meet program requirements must be completed no later than the Fall 2017 semester and be reflected on official transcripts.

NURSING EARLY ACCEPTANCE PROGRAM

BC3 is pleased to offer early acceptance into the Nursing (R.N.) Program for students who meet academic eligibility criteria. <u>ALL</u> of the criteria listed below must be met at the time of application submission along with providing official transcripts from high school and all college/universities attended aside from BC3. **Note: High School seniors are not eligible for early acceptance.

- 1. A cumulative GPA of 3.25 or better
- 2. A Biology with a laboratory component passed with a "C" or better within the past 5 years (August 2012 to present)
- 3. A Chemistry with a laboratory component passed with a "C" or better within the past 5 years (August 2012 to present)
- 4. Human Anatomy & Physiology 1 and Human Anatomy & Physiology 2 passed with a grade of "B" or better in both classes.
 - Please note: Both Human Anatomy & Physiology courses must be within the past 5 years (August 2012 to present) and taken at the same institution.
- A minimum of <u>SIX</u> additional Pre-Nursing support credits (approx. 2 classes) at the collegelevel with a grade of "C" or better.
 - General Microbiology, 4 credits
 - College Writing, 3 credits
 - > Speech, 3 credits
 - ➤ Intermediate Algebra, 3 credits
 - Physical Wellness, 2 credits
 - ➤ General Psychology, 3 credits
 - ➤ Human Growth and Development, 3 credits
- 6. A grade of "C" or better in any completed Pre-Nursing support courses.

Other Notes:

- Students who wish to be considered for early acceptance, must declare their intentions by checking the box at the bottom of this page at the time the application is submitted.
- Early Acceptance students are only eligible to apply for the Two Year Program option.
- Once the Admissions Office has verified that all criteria are met, the application will be forwarded to the Dean of Nursing & Allied Health for consideration.
- Students will be notified via USPS letter from the Dean of Nursing & Allied Health of their acceptance. Students will then have 30 days from the date of the letter to accept or deny their seat in the BC3 Nursing Program.
- Students who are not granted early acceptance, will still be considered as part of the normal review process, outlined previously in this application packet.

BUTLER COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE NURSING PROGRAM REQUIRED ABILITIES FOR NURSING COURSES

Nursing courses require that students possess the following abilities:

- Sufficient mobility to transfer and mobilize the non-ambulatory client, to assist an
 ambulatory client and to perform emergency client care. Must be able to lift
 and/or support at least 50 pounds. Must be capable of full manual dexterity of
 upper extremities and unrestricted movement of both lower extremities, neck,
 shoulders, back and hips to safely carry a newborn and perform activities of daily
 living for the client unable to do so for himself.
- 2. Sufficient musculo-skeletal control to perform gross and fine motor tasks inherent in required skills; e.g. administration of medications and urinary catheterization.
- 3. Sufficient visual ability to read records, labels on medication containers, and calibrations on devices used to make physiological measurements; to observe changes in client status; and to observe unsafe environmental conditions.
- 4. Sufficient hearing ability to interpret messages not solely based on visual cues, to interpret conversation, and to detect sounds that indicate changing client status such as heart tones, breath sounds and blood pressure.
- 5. Sufficient speech ability to convey oral messages to assigned clients and to other health team members.
- Sufficient emotional stability to accurately perceive situations influencing the care
 of assigned clients and to make unimpaired observations and judgments
 regarding care of assigned clients.

Requests for reasonable accommodations (such as prescribed medications, assistive devices, etc.) which may enable the student to perform the abilities required in the program with accommodation will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Appropriate documentation from a qualified professional or physician substantiating the need for such accommodation must be submitted to the Dean of Nursing & Allied Health for consideration. Any such information submitted shall be considered confidential and may be shared only with those who have a need to know. A request for accommodation does not necessarily guarantee the student will be able to enter and/or continue in the program. The Dean will consult with the Disability Support Services Coordinator and/or Equal Opportunity Compliance Officer if necessary and will notify the student of any action that must be taken in regard to the request.

BUTLER COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE Nursing (R.N.) Program INFORMATION FOR GENERAL APPLICANT STUDENTS

Admission to the Nursing Program is both competitive and selective. A special application packet, available from the Admissions Office or on the BC3 website (http://bc3.edu/admission/nursing.html), is required of all prospective students. Applications are accepted beginning July 1, 2017 through October 31, 2017 for August 2018 enrollment in the Nursing Program.

All applicants are considered equally without regard to race, color, religious creed, ancestry, national origin, handicap or disability, age, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, genetic information, veteran's status, marital status, family status, or other classification protected by applicable law.

**However, please note that Nursing students must be 18 years of age prior to the start of their first clinical experience.

The PA State Board of Nursing may refuse, suspend, or revoke any license in any case where the Board shall find that the applicant:

- Has been convicted or has pleaded guilty or entered a plea of nolo contendere or has been found guilty by a judge or jury of a felony or a crime of moral turpitude, or has received probation without verdict, disposition in lieu of trial or an Accelerated Rehabilitative Disposition in the disposition of felony charges, in the courts of this Commonwealth, the United States, or any other state, territory, or county;
- Has committed fraud or deceit in securing his or her admission to the practice of nursing or to nursing school;
- Is unable to practice professional nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of mental or physical illness or condition or physiological or psychological dependence upon alcohol, hallucinogenic or narcotic drugs or other drugs which tend to impair judgment or coordination, so long as such dependence shall continue.

The Nursing Admissions Committee assumes the responsibility to review the data of all applicants and has the right to select the best qualified individuals.

Special enrollment requirements UPON ACCEPTANCE include the following:

- 1. Complete required:
 - Act 34/151 Criminal Record Check through PA State Police
 - Child Abuse History Clearance through the PA Department of Welfare
 - FBI Background Check prior to beginning NURS 101 and again if re-admitted to the program

Clearance results must be in compliance with PA State Board of Nursing regulations, Act 169 Older Adult Protective Services Act, and Act 34/151. A student who fails to obtain the requisite Act 169 and Act 34/151 clearances will be unable to attend the required clinical experiences and meet course objectives.

- 2. Have a satisfactory annual physical examination, tuberculin skin test, immunizations, and negative urine drug screen. Students must have the physical and emotional ability to provide all aspects of safe nursing care. A list of required nursing abilities is available with the admission packet.
- 3. Provide evidence of successful completion of the American Heart Association cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) for the healthcare provider course.
- 4. Provide proof of health insurance coverage.
- Malpractice liability insurance is paid as part of the BC3 tuition/fee structure of all Nursing students.
- 6. Purchase required uniforms.
- 7. Assume all responsibilities for transportation to and from clinical agencies to which they are assigned for clinical practice.
- 8. Be available for variations in clinical hours and locations.

The Dean of Nursing & Allied Health will meet with accepted Nursing students at a mandatory information session to further explain the process for obtaining the necessary health and clearance requirements indicated above.

LPNs and other individuals with prior nursing education and/or experience may be eligible for advanced standing. A separate application packet is available March 1, 2018 with priority consideration given to those who apply on or before May 15, 2018 in the BC3 Admissions Office or on the BC3 website (http://bc3.edu/admission/nursing.html). As a Reminder...

- To be considered for admission, students must complete a high school or college-level Biology course with a laboratory component <u>and</u> a Chemistry course with a laboratory component <u>no more than five years before applying to the Nursing Program</u>. Both courses must be passed with a "C" or better. Please see application timeframes.
- Students who need a Biology course with a laboratory component may take the BIOL 131, A&P I class which is required in the Nursing program, or they may choose to take BIOL 101, Biology I. However, <u>BIOL 101</u>, <u>Biology I does not count toward the Nursing Program requirements.</u>
- Students who need a Chemistry course with a laboratory component should take CHEM
 112, Descriptive Chemistry, to meet this requirement.

Butler County Community College Curriculum Planner NURSING No. 208 Associate in Applied Science Degree

The Nursing Program at Butler County Community College is a two-year academically-based program that prepares the graduate to provide and manage direct care to individual clients and their families; and to function as an effective member of the health care team. The graduate is also educated to be a contributing member of the discipline of nursing, committed to professional growth, continuous learning, and self-development. Graduates are eligible to take the licensing examination for registered nurses (NCLEX-RN).
