The average comprehensive final grade for all 8 was 84.8%.</p> <p>The Success criterion is met.</p>	<p>The Program Assessment Contact (PAC) reviewed the data and notes that the assessment method is adequate, but chose to utilize all questions of the final examination, as all were deemed to be related to the outcome to be assessed.</p> <p>The PAC notes that this is the first assessment of this outcome since faculty determined the 90% success criterion was unrealistic.</p> <p>While the success criterion was met, the PAC is recommending that faculty consider the addition of an online Financial Accounting course option for (Acct 203). That process is underway with the plan for an online course to exist in the spring of 2019.</p> <p>This program began its intensive program review in the fall of 2016. This intensive review involves reviewing all of the program outcomes, the means of assessment for each, the</p>

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				<p>success criterion for each, the timelines for assessment and the use of results. The full-time accounting faculty, along with the Dean of the Business Division, reviewed the existing program assessment plan matrix and competencies and determined the program outcomes are appropriate to the discipline. However, the following changes are under review to the assessment process:</p> <p>The success criterion on all ILOCs will reflect an adequate level of competency which is defined as (75% will achieve a score of 70% or higher).</p> <p>Further outcomes of the program review include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Revise and evaluate the program's intended learning outcomes in 2017-2018.• Include MS Excel as part of the program requirement and consider including BUSN 244 as part of the program requirements

			<p>Seven Accounting program majors were enrolled and five completed the ACCT 203 course in the spring of 2019. One student that did not complete the course, stopped attending the class after week 9 of the semester. The second student stopped attending in March of 2019. The five</p>	<p>The success criterion was met. The comprehensive examination is considered adequate. Faculty note: Consideration is always given through thoughtful analysis of existing content and delivery of the content. Since the last completion of</p>

At this time, the results indicate that the Financial Accounting course (ACCT 203) meets Accounting Program requirements. Faculty also offered explanation of students who chose to drop the course: One of the students who stopped attending was from the online course. The instructor had met with her in person during office hours and continued to correspond and encourage her through email. The instructor offered to meet again with this student in person but the student failed to follow up. The second student who stopped attending was in a F2F delivery course. This student went on a six-week vacation with his parents in the middle of the semester. His attempt to return after the six-week hiatus was short-lived. The average comprehensive final exam grade was 86%.	The success criterion was met. The results indicate that the Managerial Accounting course (ACCT 234) meets Accounting Program requirements. The current course text, text resources and content are considered appropriate. Faculty reviewed the results and noted: The criteria itself is appropriate but the wording of “mastery” should be changed to “proficiency”. Also, this competency was addressed in the Fall and again this spring due to the minor modification of the success criteria increase of 70 to 75% of the students achieving the criteria of 70% or higher on the final comprehensive exam.

Faculty noted the following after review of the process and results:</p> <p>The following is a summary regarding the results that students will be able to perform administrative office procedures in a medical/business setting by having a site supervisor complete a final evaluation regarding their competencies in a medical/business setting. The results indicate that 100% of students scored outstanding on the site</p>

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				<p>supervisor final evaluation. The success criterion was met by the Medical Office students. The criteria of success should remain the same. Most of students do receive an overall performance rating of outstanding or above average as long as they adhere to the objectives and practices they have been taught in previous courses.</p> <p>The site supervisor final evaluation is a good assessment measure because all of the departmental syllabus objectives can be assessed in this evaluation. Site supervisors are given a set of instructions before completing the evaluation, cautioned not to give the student perfect ratings on the different competencies, and are also given an email with detailed instructions on how to complete the evaluation. If necessary, a phone call is done by the Program Coordinator to clarify any further questions on the final evaluation, which the site supervisor may have.</p> <p>At this time the result is not indicating that any area of</p>
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				<p>the program should be improved. Students need to adhere to all of the administrative practices taught in previous courses and treat the practicum as the first step to gaining entry into the administrative workplace. The competencies being assessed are relevant to employment in an office administration. No additional recommendations were made.</p>

Faculty reviewed the results and offered the following analysis of the results: The following is a summary regarding the results that students will be able to demonstrate desktop publishing proficiency by creating and organizing a Microsoft Publisher portfolio. The results indicate that 83% of students scored 70% or higher on the portfolio project. This was stated in the Analysis of Result Statement above and the success criteria, that 80% of the students should score 70% or higher, was referenced. Therefore, the</p>

Most students score 70% or higher if they complete the project and follow the directions on the provided rubric. The portfolio project is a comprehensive assessment measure because all the departmental syllabus objectives can be assessed in this project. At this time the result is not indicating that any area of the program should be improved.</p> <p>The project is made available to students the first day of class in Blackboard and a digital sample portfolio is available for viewing. Students are also emailed several times throughout the semester to remind them to begin working on the project. The competency being assessed is relevant to office administration staff, who are responsible for creating such publications as flyers, business card mock-ups, labels, letterheads, fax templates, envelopes, etc. The competency should be assessed again in the next</p>
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
