- -Nick is receiving many local and statewide telephone calls about President

Obama's free community college tuition proposal.

College Activities

- -The Nursing & Allied Health reaccreditation site visit is scheduled for 1/27-29.
- -Much committee work continues in preparation for the Middle States reaccreditation. The self-study report is due to Middle States in fall 2015.
- -The 50th anniversary of the College's charter is 3/03. A celebration will be held from 1:00-4:00 p.m. in the Succop Theater, AK Steel Lobby and Mary Hulton Phillips Gallery. Trustees will receive an invitation soon.
- -A meeting of the Trustees and Foundation Board of Directors is scheduled for 2/05 to discuss student housing.
