<u>Motion – National Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators</u> <u>Agreement</u>

Mr. McDowell moved to approve entering into an engagement agreement with the National Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators (NASFAA) to render at the request of BC3, a peer review of the College's processes and protocols and recommend efficiencies of its student financial aid program. For all services rendered by NASFAA under this Agreement, the College shall pay a fee of \$30,000. The Agreement is pending review by the College's solicitor. Motion Carried.
